The water soluble zinc in Granulock SuPreme Z is particularly beneficial where soil VAM levels are low, on alkaline or limed soils, after land forming and with low soil temperatures.

The sulfur in Granulock SuPreme Z is 50 per cent sulfate sulfur and 50 per cent elemental sulfur.
